The temple is visited by about 50,000 to 100,000 pilgrims daily (30 to 40 million people annually on average), while on special occasions and festivals, like the annual Brahmotsavam, the number of pilgrims shoots up to 500,000, making it the most-visited holy place in the world

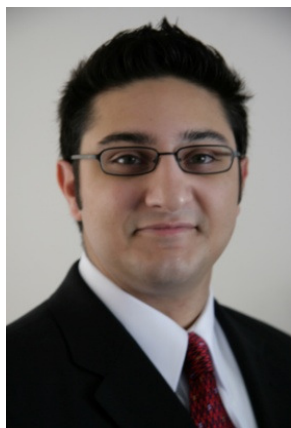

The Upanishads claim the unity of the individual with the supreme through the four statements: Prajñānam Brahma ("Consciousness is The Supreme"), "Ayam ātmā brahma" ("The Self Is The Supreme"), "Tat Tvam Asi" ("Thou art That") and "Aham Brahmasmi" (I am The Supreme).



Spirituality Through Art: In India all that exists as Vedas, Puranas, Upanishads or any kind of scriptures comes from artists. They were called rishis, saints, seers and visionaries but they were actually artists. You will find in India an old tribe of saints known as "visionary artists", who are poets, musicians, singers, sculptors and painters. These people created the greatest existing and most ancient literature of the world. The Vedas do not come from a prose writing dry intellectual mind. The Vedas are written poetry. The Bhagavad Gita is poetry. The Upanishads are poetry; its verses are so compact that only one line explains the entire law of Karma. Art is a very precise expression.
